

Tips from the EPSRC on preparing a proposal



- The most useful guidance can be found [here](#) and covers integrating impact throughout the proposal.
- A quick win is to update your JeS profile with your expertise and relevant keywords. This is the primary way the EPSRC find reviewers. If your profile is up to date, you're more likely to be found and to be asked review something - this often gives great insight in to the whole process.
- If you are interested in doing more peer review, you can apply to join the EPSRC college [here](#).
- Before you submit your proposal, go through it and 'review' it using the relevant [reviewer form](#). This forces you to look at it from the reviewers perspective, which can be very helpful.
- Develop a good relationship with your university Research Office.
- Contact the relevant EPSRC/UKRI portfolio manager if you want to discuss anything or ask questions – they are always very happy to talk. You can contact [Miriam Dowle](#) (Senior Manager, Digital Economy).
